- : a. that in term of to decrease the level of poverty and to increase the people's prosperity as mandated in the constitution of the Republic of Indonesia Year 1945, then real efforts are needed to overcome regional poverty;
 - : b. That poverty is a social and multidimensional problem in various characteristics that needs to be overcome to maintain and develop the dignity of human beings' life;
 - : c. That to provide legal standing so that the efforts in poverty alleviation may be done optimally, effectively, efficiently and integratedly programmed in sustainable manners, Regional Poverty Alleviation arrangements are needed;
 - : d. In accordance with the consideration referred on section a, section b, and section c, Regional Regulations on Regional Poverty Alleviation are needed to be stipulated;

Stipulating : REGIONAL REGULATIONS REGARDING POVERTY ALLEVATION IN CENTRAL JAVA PROVINCE

BAB 1

GENERAL TERMS

Article 1

In this Regional Regulation, these terms mean:

1. Region is Central Java Province.
2. Local Government is Governor as the element of Local Government Administrator who is in charge in implementing government affairs that has become autonomous regional authority.
3. Governor is Central Java Governor.
4. Regional Apparatus is the element of The Assistants of Governor and The Regional House of Representatives in implementing government affairs that has become autonomous regional authority.
5. Poverty Allevation is The Policy and Program of State and Local Government done sistematically, planned and synergistic with business world and society to decrease the amount of the poors in terms of increasing people welfare.
6. Poverty Allevation Program is an action which is done by State Government, Local Government, Business World and society to improve The poors' Welfare through social aid, community empowerment, empowerment of micro and small enterprises, and also other programs in terms of improving economics activity.
7. The Poor is an individual who has no source of livelihood wahtsoever and/or an individual who has a source of income but he/she doesn't have a capability to fulfil the proper basic needs for him/her or family.
8. Vulnerable Person is an individual, a family, a group, and/or a society that could not afford to do their social function because of their obstacles, difficulties or disturbances, so that they could not fulfil their basic needs physiccally, mentally or socially in proper ways.
9. Basic Need is The need for food, clothing, shelter, health, education, jobs and/or social service.
10. Social Protection is all efforts that are conducted to prevent and overcome the risk from social shock and vulnaribility.

11. Empowerment of Poor Family and Vulnerable is all efforts that are conducted to make Poor Family and Vulnerable have source and resource to fulfil the basic needs.
12. Empowerment of micro and small enterprises is all efforts that are conducted to make Poor Family and Vulnerable have source and resource to fulfil the basic needs through micro and small enterprises.
13. Regional Poverty Alleviation Coordination Team, and so called RPACT, is the cross-sectoral coordination unit and cross-stakeholder for Poverty Alleviation in a region.
14. Regional long term development plan and so called RLTPD is a regional planning document for 20 years periode.
15. Regional Medium-Term Development Plan as so called RMTDP is is a regional planning document for 5 years periode effective from the date of innauguration to the end of term of the district head.
16. Poverty Data is information on the number and image of family or household that is categorized into the poor.
17. The Poor Data Collection is an activity of collecting numeric information regarding characteristics or specification on the poor population done by The Local Government.

Article 2

- Regional Poverty Alleviation is implemented on the basis:
 - a. Objectivity
 - b. Transparency
 - c. Justice, and
 - d. Accountability

Article 3

- Regional Poverty Alleviation is implemented on the principles:
 - a. Empowerment
 - b. Participatory
 - c. Synergized
 - d. Measured
 - e. Transparent and Accountable; and
 - f. Sustainable

BAB II
POLICY, STRATEGY AND OBJECTIVE
OF POVERTY ALLEVATION

Article 4

1. Local Government arranges and stipulates policy, strategy and objectives of regional Poverty Allevation.
2. The policy of Poverty Allevation as referred on point [1] based on RLTPD and RMTDP.
3. Regional Apparatus organizes Poverty Allevation Program based on policy, strategy, and objective of Poverty Allevation as referred on point [1] as its own charged.

Article 5

- The Policy of Poverty Allevation as referred to Article 4 point [1] covers:
 - a. Improving integration, synchronization, and coordination among Poverty Allevation performers.
 - b. Improving the basic needs service for Poor Family and Vulnerable People.
 - c. Improving basic skill and independence of Poor Family and Vulnerable People.

Article 6

1. Strategy of Poverty Allevation as referred to Article 4 point [1] is implemented with:
 - a. reduction of production burden of individuals or poor Family and Vulnerable People.
 - b. Improvement of skill and income of individuals or poor Family and Vulnerable People.
 - c. Development and ensure sustainability of micro and small enterprises.
 - d. Synergi of Policy and Poverty Allevation Program
2. The activity supporting Poverty Allevation Strategy as referred to point [1] can be developed in terms of fulfillment of social rehabilitation, social security, social empowerment and social protection.

Article 7

- The Objectives of Poverty Allevation as referred to Article 4 point [1] covers:
 - a. To manage Poverty data accurately;
 - b. To build and strenghten the synergy among Poverty Allevation Performers;

- c. To fulfil the basic needs of poor family and Vulnerable people; and
- d. To improve skill of poor family and Vulnerable people in developing potentials.

BAB III THE EFFORTS OF POVERTY ALLEVATION

Article 8

1. The efforts of Poverty Allevation is implemented by:
 - a. Social Protection program
 - b. Poor Family and Vulnerable People Empowerment Program; and
 - c. Micro and small enterprises Empowerment Program.
2. The Efforts of Poverty Allevation are implemented by Poverty Allevation Performers.
3. The Efforts of Poverty Allevation as referred to point [2] are implemented synergistically, continuously and sustainably.

Article 9

1. Social Protection Program as referred to Article 8 point [1] section a. Is implemented to ensure the fulfillment of basic poor family rights and vulnerable people.
2. Social Protection Program as referred to point [1] is applied through activities such as;
 - a. Fulfillment of Basic Needs on Food and Clothing;
 - b. Health
 - c. Education
 - d. Social
 - e. Availability of Home and Shelter access; and/or
 - f. Safe Protection.

Article 10

1. Empowerment Program of Poor Family and Vulnerable People as referred to Article 8 point [1] section b, is implemented to improve business skill.
2. Empowerment Program of Poor Family and Vulnerable People as referred to Article 8 point [1] is realized through activities such as;
 - a. Technical Guidance on skill Improvement;
 - b. The Availability of Access to Job and Business Opportunity; and/or
 - c. The availability of access to business capital.

Article 11

1. Empowerment Program on Micro and small enterprises as referred to Article 8 point [1] section c, is implemented to improve the independence following the implementation of Poor Family and Vulnerable People Empowerment.
2. Empowerment Program on Micro and small enterprises as referred to Article 8 point [1] is implemented by:
 - a. business strengthening training
 - b. strengthening business capital; and/or
 - c. marketing business results.

Article 12

Further provisions regarding the implementation of programs in poverty alleviation efforts are regulated by governor regulations.

BAB IV THE DATA OF POVERTY ALLEVIATION

Article 13

1. In Poverty Allevation efforts, Local Government has used data released by Social Affairs Ministry.
2. The data using as referred to point [1] is coordinated by Regional Apparatus who organize Social affairs.
3. Data released by Social Affairs Ministry as referred to point [1], is the data that is obtained from the poor's data collection done by sub-district level officers and village level officers stipulated by Head of Regional Apparatus who organizes social affairs.

Article 14

1. In addition to using data released by the Ministry of Social Affairs, Local Government may implement the poverty data collection independently in a way for Poverty Allevation Effort.
2. the poverty data collection independently as referred to point [1] has a function as a comparative data.
3. the poverty data collection independently as referred to point [1] is arranged more details in Governor Regulations.

BAB V
THE IMPLEMENTATION

Article 15

1. The Poverty Allevation is implemented gradually, integrated, consistently, and continuously in accordance with priority scale by considering local government resource capabilities and poor people needs.
2. The Poverty Allevation is implemented by Regional Apparatus having authority to implement main assignment and function according to the program as referred to Article 8 point [1].
3. The Poverty Allevation is coordinated by RPACT.

BAB VI
REGIONAL POVERTY ALLEVIATION COORDINATION TEAM

Article 16

1. RPACT is formed in order to improve the coordination of Poverty Allevation in specific Region.
2. RPACT as referred to point [1] is formed with Governor Decision.
3. RPACT is under the Governor.

Article 17

1. RPACT as referred to Article 16 covers Local Government elements, society, business world and other stakeholders in Poverty Allevation.
2. The Chairman of RPACT as referred to point [1] is Vice Governor.
3. The Secretary of RPACT as referred to point [1]. Is Head of Regional Apparatus who is in charge of development planning.

Article 18

RPACT as referred to Article 16 and Article 17 has duties:

- a. Coordinating Poverty Allevation in the Region; and
- b. Controlling the implementation of Poverty Allevation in the Region.

Article 19

Task Specification, membership structure, group work, secretariat, and RPACT funding are stipulated with Governor Decision.

BAB VII SUPERVISING, MONITORING AND EVALUATING

Article 20

In terms of supervising on the implementation of Poverty Allevation, Local Government establishes monitoring system and integrated evaluation.

Article 21

RPACT conducts supervision, monitoring, and evaluation while compiling implementation report on Poverty Allevation periodically.

Article 22

RPACT delivers implementation annual report on Poverty Allevation Program to The Governor.

BAB VIII THE COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION

Article 23

1. The Community is provided vast opportunity to play an active role in Poverty Allevation implemented by State Government, Provincial Government, Local Government, business world or society from the process of planning, implementing, supervising, monitoring and evaluating.
2. The Community as referred to point [1] covers individuals, family, groups, social organization, foundation, non-governmental organization, profession organization, business world element, industrial field element and community organizations.
3. Business world element and industrial field element as referred to point [2] have actively involved in funding and/or goods and/or service for Poverty Allevation as manifestation of social responsibility.
4. Poverty Allevation Program implemented by the community, business world and industrial field as referred to point [2]

and point [3] must be aligned with strategy and Poverty Allevation program and having coordinated with RPACT.

BAB IX
FUNDING

Article 24

The Funding for the Implementation of Poverty Allevation Program sourced from:

- a. regional revenue and expenditure budget; and/or
- b. non-binding third party funding sources based on provisions of laws and regulations.

BAB X
CLOSING

Article 25

This regional regulation comes into force on the date of promulgation.

I. GENERAL

Poverty is an urgent nation problem and needs to have ways of overcoming and approaching which are systematic, integrated, and comprehensive in terms of reducing the burden and fulfilling basic rights of citizens properly through inclusive development, in justicen and sustainable to realize a life with dignity.

In a way to accelerate on Poverty Allevation, it needs to be implemented coordination ways integratedly in preparing the formulation and implementation of poverty alleviation policies.

In the preamble to the 1945 Constitution of the Republic of Indonesia, it is clearly stated that the state is to protect the general welfare, to educate the nation, and to participate in implementing world order based on independence, eternal peace and social justice. To achieve the state's goals, the state, through its government units, including regional governments, is obliged to improve the welfare of all its citizens from conditions of poverty and destitution, as mandated in the Preamble to the 1945 Constitution of the Republic of Indonesia.

In order to accelerate regional poverty alleviation in Central Java Province, the Regional Regulation on Regional Poverty Alleviation is expected to accelerate, synergize and sustain the poverty alleviation program so that it needs to be regulated by issuing a Regional Regulation on Regional Poverty Alleviation.

II. ARTICLE BY ARTICLE

Article 1

Self-explanatory

Article 2

Section a

'Objective' means base everything on reality (as it is) or information and arguments that can be accounted for, not just based on personal views or desires.

Section b

'Transparent' means open, namely the rules and steps taken by poverty alleviation actors can be monitored and known by the public.

Section c

'Justice' means standard treatment, namely anyone who meets the criteria can obtain their rights

Section d

'Accountable' means readiness to be accountable at any time for decisions and actions that have been taken

Article 3

Section a

'Empowerment' means strive to ensure that citizens, families or communities can manage and resolve their own problems

Section b

'participatory' means always involve the community

Section c

'synergize' means working together to maximize the use of the potential of each poverty alleviation actor so as to produce better results.

Section d

'measured' means can be expressed in certain measurements, both quantitatively and qualitatively

Section e

'Transparent and Accountable' means All poverty alleviation programs and activities must be transparent and accessible to all stakeholders. All poverty alleviation actors must be accountable to the public for everything they have done, are doing, and will do.

Section f

'sustainable' means There is a connection and development between the activities currently being carried out and the same activities in the past, and it is possible that there will be a connection and development with the same activities in the future.
